




AUDI AND BEST BUDDIES

Early risers were stretching their muscles the morning of October 24 to take part in the inaugural Audi Best Buddies Challenge in Toronto. The courses were mapped out around Shops at Don Mills—a 10-kilometre run, a five-kilometre walk, and a one-kilometre walk, making it an event for athletes of every level. Racing alongside the participants were a number of celebrities, including *ET Canada* Senior Entertainment Reporter Rosy Edeh, actor Kathleen Robertson, and Olympic bronze medalist Joannie Rochette. Pre- and post-race, participants sipped Nespresso coffee while reading issues of NUVO magazine in the NUVO Nespresso lounge. Proceeds from the race challenge benefited Best Buddies Canada, a non-profit organization committed to facilitating one-on-one friendships between students and people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. WOMEN AND FINANCE

In December, a new financial report based on a national survey was officially released at Toronto’s Gardiner Museum at a discussion forum aimed at reshaping the conceptions of the role of finance in women’s lives. The report, titled *Financial Lives of Girls and Women*, challenges dominant assumptions and stereotypes about the financial behaviour of Canadian women. The evening was moderated by Barbara Stewart, a Chartered Financial Analyst and shareholder of Cumberland Private. After reviewing the key points that emerged from the survey—specifically that the majority of Canadian women are very confident in financial and investment matters—Stewart opened the discussion to a panel of financial experts.
